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Where am I coming from


- 20 years teaching in International Development in US, New Zealand and UK


Academic creativity

- Ken Robinson 'ability to leap out of familiar habits into new ideas spaces'
- Alison James and Stephen Brookfield - 'move away from the well-trodden, to sniff out the subtle indicators of possibility and to move sideways and beyond'
- Ronald Barnett 5 forms of creative university
- Not corporate-managerialist creativity (Rob Pope)
- Everyday creative potential
- Continuum between critique and creativity



Critical-creative pedagogy

- Whole-person learning
- Creative design & arts methods
- Praxis
- Critical hope
- 4 strands interweave into an expandable sphere

Whole-person learning

- Invite students to bring not only their intellects but also bodies, emotions and senses into classroom
- Experiential learning
- Safe spaces, clear structures, caring facilitation
- Body mapping, serious games
- Students collectively write Brighton Manifesto based on their own experiences of living in city

Design and arts methods


- Global challenges as wicked problems
- Capacity to imagine, experiment, empathize
- Ask open-ended questions
- Be comfortable with ambiguity
- Materiality and resource politics of teaching
- Students building scenarios of desired urban futures for Brighton 2050

Praxis

- Paolo Freire: practice informed by theory, reflection, dialogue
- Not saviorism
- Applied learning
- Problem-focused learning
- Learning by doing together
- Students mapping campus infrastructures, developing sustainability plan

Critical hope

- Cultivate an aware, hopeful stance
- Not naiveté or fantasy
- Reflexive, reparative, active
- Sussex students organizing Brighton school climate strikes
- Students designing activism campaigns on issues they want to change
- Student housing cooperatives

Alternative responses to 21st century challenges

- Remaking academic subjectivities (generative theory, decolonizing and decentering)
- Reclaiming economies
 (degrowth, diverse, community and solidarity economies)
- Repairing ecologies (deep ecology, systems and complexity thinking, Buen Vivir)
- Prefiguring alternatives (teach outs, co-creation, activism)
