Examining Recent Government Policies

- This presentation analyzes the key measures implemented by President Javier Milei's government concerning public state universities in Argentina.
- President Milei began his term in December 2023.



Public Universities in Argentina

Free and Accessible Higher Education

- Since the mid-20th century, state universities in Argentina have provided free and unrestricted access.
- Argentina has 115 universities in total.
 - 63 are public institutions, educating 80% of the country's 2.5 million students (Official data from the University Information Department, Ministry of Education, Argentina, 2024).



Current Administration's Policies



Core Tenets of the Milei Government's Approach

- Systematic underfunding of the public education system.
- Sustained criticism of the public education system.

Underfunding: Impact on Salaries



Deterioration of Teaching Staff's Purchasing Power

Over **70** percentage points of purchasing power lost by teaching salaries during 2024, a trend that continues.

The accumulated salary loss between December 2023 and January 2025 is equivalent to **4.6** salaries.

This effectively means nearly **five months of unpaid**work during this period.

Underfunding: University Budget Reductions

Budget Freezing and Arbitrary Updates

Decreased university budget since the current government took office.

The 2023 budget was extended to 2024 and 2025.

Updates are based on arbitrary criteria, disregarding the Education Financing Law.

The **veto of Law N° 27.757**, which was supported by the university community and approved by the National Congress.



Impact on Science and Technology (S&T)



Science and Technology (S&T) production in Argentina is primarily conducted within state universities.

Significant cuts to research scholarships in 2024:

Doctoral scholarships: from 1,300 projected to **950** awarded.

Postdoctoral scholarships: from 800 projected to **500** awarded.

Stalled university construction projects:

Resulting in less laboratory equipment.

Reduced infrastructure for faculty and students.

Decreased and frozen "Becas Progresar" grants, designated for low-income students.

Summary and Conclusion

Systematic underfunding of public state universities.

(In contrast to significant transfers to internal intelligence and state repression mechanisms).

Dismantling of the Science and Technology system:

Overall underfunding.

Suspension of scientific projects.

Closure of scientific production entities (e.g., INTA, crucial for the agricultural

University research scientists earned less than in

2002.
