- Extensive literature survey
- Interviews with:
 - central policy makers in England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland
 - 12 HEIs, drawing on Russell Group, pre-92, post-92, post-post-92 and an 'alternative provider'
- Planned book publication:
 - The governance of UK higher education: the impact of governmental, financial and market pressures
 - Bloomsbury Academic, Spring 2019





Research Themes







- The interaction between state governance and institutional governance
- The impact of devolution on UK HE system governance:
 - the emergence of different models within a single state;
 - the rejection of the English market model in Wales and Scotland;
 - inequality between the different systems







- Institutional diversity and diversity in institutional governance:
 - the 'business model' of university governance;
 - academic participation and research intensity;
 - the 'laification' of university governance;
 - the 'executive chair/compliant vc or the compliant chair/dominant vc;
 - the rise of the 'executive';
 - the market and academic priorities;
 - governance in the private sector.
- Is university governance fit for purpose?
- How supportive are current governance changes to either teaching or research?
